Dear Students and Parents,

As we look at the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester of the 09-10 school year, we need to pause and consider what has been accomplished and how that compares to the goals we have for ourselves. What are our goals at Holdrege High School? Unlike elementary school or middle school, once students finish high school, they are finished with our system. Some will go on to 4 year colleges. Some will go on to community colleges or technical schools. Some will join the military, while others will enter the workforce. It is not realistic to say we will teach them “everything” they need to know. The options are so varied and the students so different, that we can’t cover all the information they will require. So how can we accommodate this wide variety of needs for our students?

What we continue to hear from post-secondary institutions and workforce leaders is that the students leaving high schools today need “skills” more than they need “content.” This is not to say that the subjects we offer are irrelevant, but most people understand that our world of knowledge changes so fast today, we can’t possibly keep up with everything. What we need to consider for our students are 21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills.

What exactly does it mean when we say 21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills? Our students need to leave HS with the ability to find and evaluate information. They need to be able to collaborate on projects and work within groups to solve problems. They need mental and emotional agility in order to relate to a variety of situations and people while remaining constructive. They need a sense of initiative and drive that motivates them to discover new possibilities and new answers. In his book The Global Achievement Gap: Why Even Our Best Schools Don’t Teach the New Survival Skills Our Children Need – And What We Can Do About It, Tony Wagner details some of these needs for our students to become productive members of the modern information age we have moved into. His belief is that we need to do a better job of preparing our students HOW to learn instead of the traditional focus of WHAT they learn. Many of the occupations our current students will hold have not even been invented yet, so how can we teach the kids content that is relevant. The “Three R’s” will always be important, but there needs to be more of a focus on how our students learn now and how they will continue to learn in the future.

As a high school faculty, school district, community, state and nation, we need to begin the conversations about how to change our schools to become more meaningful to students now and in the future. The structures and strategies we used 50, 40 or even 20 years ago served our students well, but they were geared to a different kind of world. As Wagner stated, “mastery of the basic skills of reading, writing and math is no longer enough.” We owe it to our youth to prepare them for their future and not for our past. Together, we can find ways to make that happen.

effort to better serve patrons, HHS has annually run a satisfaction survey at parent-teacher conferences in the fall. While this information is useful, we would like more regular feedback to use in our decision making process. By using the survey module on Infinite Campus, we will now be able to do this. When 2<sup>nd</sup> semester conferences are held in

February, we will make those same 12 questions available to all our patrons through the parent portal on Infinite Campus. Anyone who has access to information for their student on the portal will be asked to quickly fill out the survey to begin compiling data for both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semesters each year. A notice will pop up on your screen when you log in to the site during that week. We appreciate the responses given and hope to continue improving communications with the households we serve.



## **LUNCH UPDATE INCLUDES USE OF INFINITE CAMPUS:**

At the December School Board meeting, the Board of Education voted to approve a contract with Computer Information Concepts to add lunch and online payment interface to our existing services, and to purchase lunch equipment from Infinite Campus that will allow parents to access lunch account information. This service will allow parents to track the expenses incurred on their child's account and also to make payments to the account electronically. This upgrade in service will be completed in January as soon as the equipment arrives and it can be installed. In order to access this service, parents must be able to log into their child's account on Infinite Campus, which is Holdrege Public Schools student information program. As parents, you can also obtain attendance information, behavior reports, fee payment information and your student's grades from Infinite Campus. If you already have a login and a password to access any of your children's information, you are ready to go. You do not need a separate login for each child. If you do not have a login, we need to have you complete the form that is attached so we can get you ready. The Infinite Campus program will be used throughout your child's education career at Holdrege Public Schools so this login and password can be used each year.

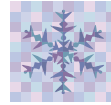
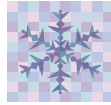
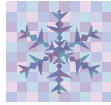

**GRADING INFORMATION:** Holdrege High School awards credit for classes based on semester grades. Quarter grades are only an indicator of current achievement in the course. Consequently, 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter progress reports are only any indicator of the current grade for the student. No credit is awarded based on the 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter grade. At the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester, December 22, students will be given a semester grade only. Credit will be awarded based on the semester grade and attendance. Students will not be given a 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter grade as the semester grade is the grade the students have earned for the semester. ALSO – As there is no official quarter grade, there will no longer be an honor roll by the quarter. Honor roll will be determined using semester grades only.

**PROM AT HOLDREGE HIGH SCHOOL:** While prom is schedule for March 27, 2010, we know many of the girls are starting to shop for prom dresses. Remember that Holdrege High School does have a dress code for prom. The dress code applies to all students and their guests attending this event. Holdrege High School students and administration developed this dress code. If you have questions about the dress code, please feel free to contact the high school office.

### *Prom Dress Code Reminder*

Prom is an important and integral part of the school experience at Holdrege High School and for the Holdrege community. Prom provides an opportunity for students and faculty members to interact at a formal social event. Preserving prom as a formal social event and positive learning experience for students is a priority for Holdrege High School.

Everyone attending prom, including guests, is expected to dress and behave appropriately for a formal evening social event. This would include the following guidelines:

Young men are expected to wear formal evening attire that would include a tuxedo, suit with a tie, or sport coat and slacks with a tie. Young women are expected to wear formal evening attire that would include a formal evening gown or other similar dresses/outfits. Dresses may not expose a bare midriff or have a side slit higher than the tips of the wearer's fingers when the wearer's hands are at her sides. Two-piece dresses/outfits are allowed provided that they do not expose any midriff.

- Body piercings other than those in the ear are not allowed.
- Exposed tattoos are not allowed.
- Public displays of affection other than holding hands are not permitted.
- All other Holdrege High School behavior rules will apply for the entire evening.

Prom is intended to be a fun and positive learning experience for all students. The above guidelines will be enforced for the prom dinner and dance. Faculty members will make the final decision as to whether a student's dress and behavior are appropriate. Students and guests may be asked to leave prom if their dress or behavior does not meet the above guidelines.
